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Redcliff Master Plan approved



The Municipality of Redcliff is pleased to announce that its Master Plan has been approved by the Ministry of Local Government and Public Works.

The development comes as a positive move towards the development of the community as it provides a clear framework for orderly land use, zoning, and infrastructure development, helping to prevent unplanned settlements and promoting sustainable growth. With a defined spatial plan, the Municipality can efficiently plan and deliver essential services such as water, sewer, roads, and waste management, improving residents' quality of life.

An approved Master Plan enhances investor confidence by providing certainty and clarity on land use and development priorities, making Redcliff more

attractive for business and industrial investment. The plan facilitates the allocation of land for residential development, enabling the Municipality to address housing demand and reduce informal settlements. It enables coordinated development of key infrastructure, including roads, commercial Centre's, and utilities, ensuring alignment with long-term growth projections.

The Master Plan incorporates environmental safeguards, promoting sustainable land use and resilience against challenges such as climate change and resource constraints.

The approval of the Master Plan signals a new era for the Municipality of Redcliff, laying a solid foundation for planned growth, improved service delivery, and sustainable urban transformation.

Council top management signs performance contracts

Middle management is expected to undertake the same process soon as the Municipality continues to entrench a results-oriented culture focused on improved governance and quality service delivery to residents and stakeholders.

Council empowers Junior Councillors

The Municipality of Redcliff has taken significant steps to empower its Junior Councillors by giving them an important role in representing their constituencies through various Council programmes and by working closely with their senior counterparts.

Speaking during the introduction of the 11 Junior Councillors for 2026, Town Clerk Mr. Gilson Chakauya said the Municipality had made a deliberate move to ensure that Junior Councillors become more visible and actively involved in Council activities.

“Perhaps I am sure we were not even aware of the previous Junior Councillors, but from now on we have made a deliberate move to empower them by firstly ensuring that they play a key role in Council programmes, one of them being the Full Council meeting. Their report will also form part of the Gender, Women, Youth and Disabled Committee. We

want them to play a key role in highlighting problems that their counterparts are facing in the community and come up with proposals to address those challenges,” he said.

Out of the 11 Junior Councillors for 2026, six are female while five are male, reflecting the Municipality’s commitment to gender inclusivity and youth participation in governance. Two of the Junior Councillors also represent the constituency of persons living with disabilities, further promoting inclusivity and representation.

The Junior Councillors were drawn from Redcliff’s three high schools namely Drake High School, Rutendo High School and Batanai High School.

The initiative demonstrates the Municipality’s commitment to nurturing future leaders and creating platforms for young people to actively participate in local governance and community development.

VANDALISM AND THEFT OF COUNCIL PROPERTY

The Municipality of Redcliff is deeply concerned about the increasing cases of vandalism and theft of Council property, particularly water infrastructure such as pipes, valves, meters, pumps, and related equipment.

These criminal activities are negatively affecting service delivery and contributing to persistent water supply challenges being experienced in some areas. Council would like to issue a stern warning that anyone found vandalising or stealing Council property will face the full wrath of the law. Strong disciplinary and legal action will be taken against offenders, including prosecution through the courts.

Residents are urged to safeguard public infrastructure and promptly report any suspected cases of vandalism, theft, or suspicious activities to the Zimbabwe Republic Police or Council offices.

The Municipality appeals for the cooperation of all stakeholders in protecting public infrastructure for the benefit of the entire community.

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Council installs solar street lights



The Municipality of Redcliff has rolled out a programme to install solar-powered street lights as part of its transition towards smart and sustainable energy solutions.

Council will begin by installing 50 solar-powered street lights from Redcliff Turn-Off to Zisco in a pilot project that marks the beginning of a wider rollout of clean energy infrastructure across the town.

The pilot project is expected to pave the way for a massive expansion programme that will eventually extend into residential areas. Going forward, Council plans to gradually replace conventional street light-

ing systems with solar-powered lights as part of its commitment to adopting clean and renewable energy solutions by 2030.

The initiative is aimed at improving public lighting, enhancing security, reducing energy costs, and promoting environmental sustainability in line with modern urban development goals.

Through the adoption of solar technology, the Municipality continues to position itself as a forward-looking local authority committed to building a smarter, greener, and more resilient urban environment.



WaMambo abattoir brings economic growth

The recently opened, indigenously owned WaMambo Abattoir is expected to significantly boost the local gross domestic product (GDP) of Redcliff. As the second abattoir in the town, after MC Meats, the facility enhances local value addition in the livestock sector, creates employment opportunities, and strengthens the town's industrial base.

By promoting local processing of meat products, WaMambo Abattoir reduces reliance on external suppliers, supports surrounding rural farmers, and contributes to increased economic activity within the district. Residents are also reminded to ensure that their dogs are properly confined within their designated premises and are not allowed to roam freely in the streets, in line with Council by-laws and public safety requirements.

DOG REGISTRATION REMINDER

The Municipality of Redcliff wishes to remind all residents and dog owners within Redcliff Municipality that dog licences are now due for renewal. In accordance with municipal by-laws governing the keeping and control of dogs, all dog owners are required to ensure that their dogs are registered and licensed with the Municipality.

Dog registration is US\$10 per year.

Residents are advised to visit the Municipal Offices and complete payment for dog licences on or before 31 May 2026 to avoid penalties or enforcement measures.

Failure to register and license dogs may result in fines, impounding of unlicensed dogs, or other legal action as provided for under relevant municipal regulations.

Dog owners are also reminded to ensure their dogs are properly restrained and do not pose a nuisance or danger to the community.

PROHIBITION OF OPEN FIRES IN ZIMASCO HOUSING SCHEME

We would like to inform all residents and stand owners in the Zimasco Housing Scheme that construction of the water and sewer reticulation network is currently underway in the ZIMASCO Housing Scheme area.

During this phase of the project, sections of water and sewer pipes have already been laid but remain exposed in some areas pending covering and backfilling.

Residents and stand owners are therefore strongly advised to desist from starting fires for land clearing or any other purpose within the Scheme area.

Starting fires in the area poses serious risks, including, burning and damaging exposed water and sewer pipes, causing costly delays and disruption to the project, impeding construction progress and delaying the provision of water and sewer services to stands.

The Municipality appeals for your cooperation in protecting this vital infrastructure and ensuring that the project is completed on schedule for the benefit of all residents.
