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Council completes major Simbi Park sewer upgrade project



The Municipality of Redcliff is delighted to announce the successful completion of the sewer upgrade project in Simbi Park at the ZCC Church.

The project involved the replacement of approximately 150 metres of the existing 150mm asbestos cement (AC) sewer line with a new 250mm PVC sewer pipeline, significantly improving the capacity and reliability of the sewer network in the area.

This project forms part of the Municipality's broader sewer infrastructure rehabilitation programme, which targets the upgrading of approximately 1,250 metres of sewer lines across Redcliff. The programme

is aimed at reducing sewer blockages and bursts, improving service delivery, protecting public health, and maintaining a clean and healthy environment for all residents. During the course of the works, a water pipeline supplying parts of Simbi Park and Millennium Park was affected, resulting in a temporary interruption to water supply in the affected areas. Restoration works have now been completed, and water supply is expected to resume shortly.

Water and Sanitation Engineer, Bright Mangoma said they have already started works on yet another major project in Simbi Park, which will go a long way in alleviating raw sewer flow in the area.

Municipality of Redcliff Holds Policies and Standard Operating Procedures Workshop

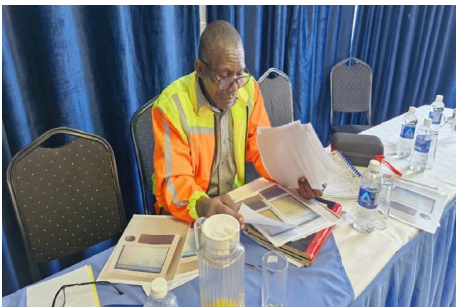

Council conducts health outreach program

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Council conducts Infrastructure Development and Road Rehabilitation Projects.

The Municipality of Redcliff continues to implement road rehabilitation and maintenance projects across the town as part of its commitment to improving public infrastructure and service delivery. These projects are aimed at preserving lives, improving trafficability, enhancing road safety, and extending the lifespan of the Municipality's road network.

During the first half of 2026, Council successfully undertook a number of key road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, including:

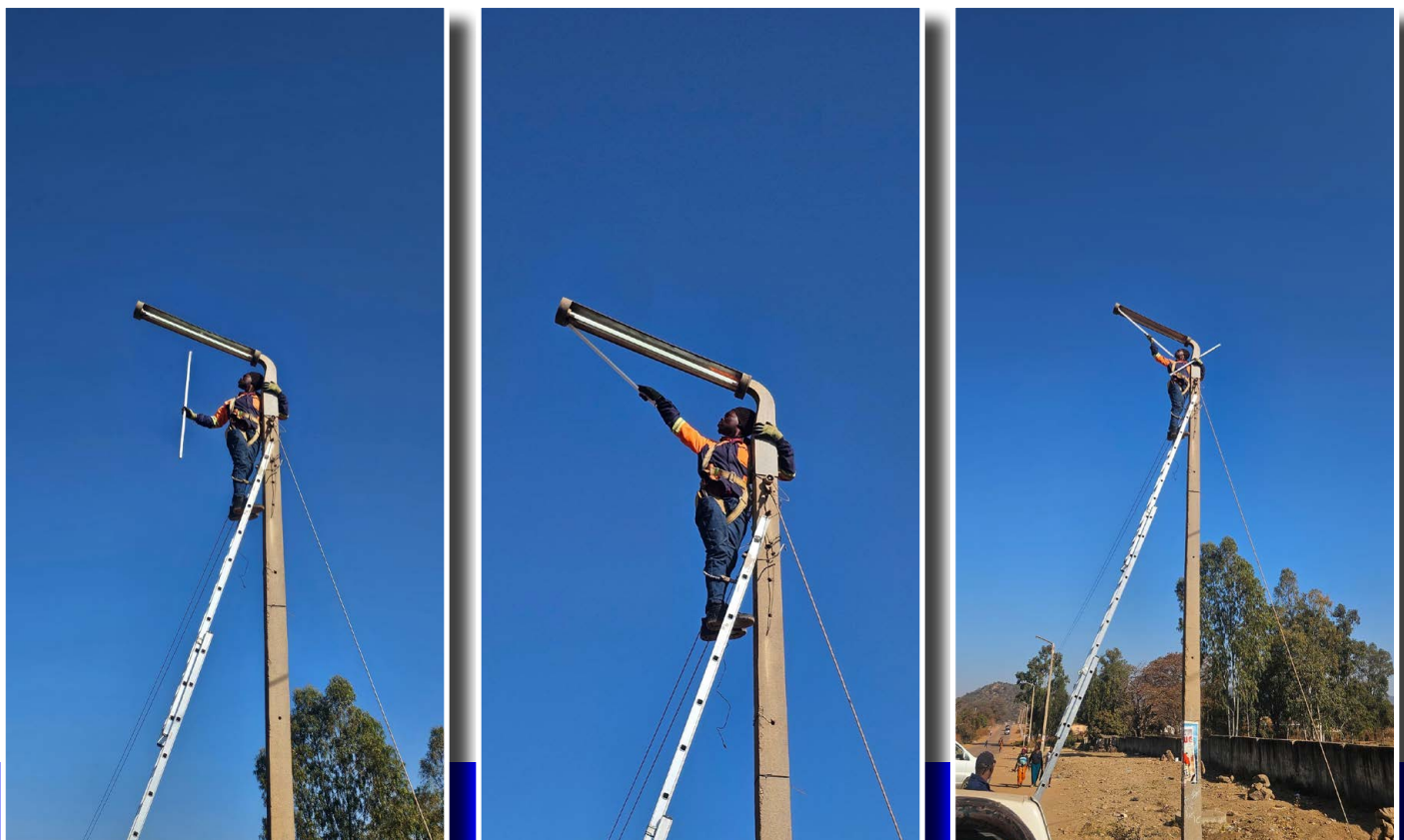
- Pothole patching along Rutendo Road to improve the condition of the road surface and ensure safer travel.
- Regravelling of minor roads in Rutendo, enhancing accessibility for residents and motorists.
- Road line marking along Zisco Road to improve

traffic management and road user safety.

- Rehabilitation of streetlights along Rutendo Road, improving visibility and security for motorists and pedestrians during the night.

- Opening and clearing of drainage systems along Msasa Road in preparation for the onset of the rainy season, thereby reducing the risk of flooding and protecting road infrastructure.

These infrastructure interventions demonstrate Council's continued investment in maintaining a safe, efficient, and reliable transport network. The Municipality remains committed to rehabilitating critical infrastructure as resources permit, while supporting economic development and improving the quality of life for residents as we march towards attaining a City Status by 2030.
